

# One Lincoln Park transportation services stand apart from the rest

Offered seven days a week from 8:00am to 5:00pm, you won't find this level of personal, chauffeured transportation at any other senior living community. We would like to share with you the details of our services:

#### **PERSONNEL & EQUIPMENT: We**

have a Transportation Supervisor and 16 drivers. Fleet consists of one Buick Lucerne, five Lincoln MKZ's and one 14 passenger bus.

AREA OF COVERAGE: Within 15 miles of One Lincoln Park: I-70 to the North; Diamond Mill Road to the West; SR 73 to the South; and SR 42 and 68 to Xenia, Route 235 and I-675 to the East.

**SCHEDULING:** We request 24 hours or more notice for scheduling trips. Same day doctor's

appointments, and prescription pick-up are accommodated whenever possible. We also try to meet scheduled pickup times within a 15 minute window as closely as possible.

CHURCHES: We transport residents to several different churches on Sundays. There is a bus trip to St. Albert's every Saturday.

**SHOPPING TRIPS:** Shopping trips are scheduled almost every day:

**Tuesday**: Kroger with departure at 10am – pickup at 11:15am **Tuesday**: Dorothy Lane Market with departure at 1pm – pickup at 2pm

**Thursday**: Meijer with departure at 2pm – pickup at 3:15pm **Friday**: Kroger with departure at 10am – pickup at 11:15am

**Friday:** Dorothy Lane Market with departure at 1pm – pickup at 2pm **Saturday:** Meijer with departure at 10am – pickup at 11:15am

**EVENING TRIPS:** Residents will be accommodated for trips scheduled after 5:00pm for an hourly fee.

PARKING: There are several parking options available for residents - carports for a monthly fee, or reserved and open spaces at no charge. Residents may use the valet service daily as needed.

VALET SERVICES: Our transportation department will bring your car up to the entrance, as well as park your car upon return. During the winter, we will remove snow and warm your vehicle up before your departure time.

## What is involved with speech, occupational and physical therapies?

Lincoln Park Manor offers extensive rehabilitation services.

#### **SPEECH THERAPY**

Sometimes an illness, hearing impairment, or other disability can rob you of the ability to talk and communicate. Speech-language therapy is all about improving swallowing, relearning word formation, and your ability to speak and remember.

WHOM WE HELP: Any adult with communication or swallowing deficits including those with aphasia, dysarthria, apraxia of speech, traumatic brain injury, dysphagia, dementia or other neurologic impairment.

**WHAT TO EXPECT:** Following hospitalization or a medical illness, speech and swallowing abilities may not return overnight. Common treatments may include strengthening exercises, viewing visual aids, cognitive exercises, as well as developing problem solving strategies for a successful rehabilitation.

#### **SPEECH THERAPY SERVICES**

- Diagnostic testing
- Speech/language treatment
- Voice treatment & swallowing
- Cognitive linguistic retraining
- Individual treatment plans

#### **OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY**

Occupational therapy is one-onone skilled treatment aimed at helping someone resume the abilities required for independent living. For example, your doctor might prescribe occupational therapy following a heart attack or stroke, for a chronic condition such as arthritis, or for problems maintaining balance.

WHOM WE HELP: Adults of any age, who need to regain motor skills or to compensate for a permanent loss to successfully perform tasks such as dressing, cooking, eating, or computer use.

WHAT TO EXPECT: Following an illness or injury, the process of relearning skills may require a stay in our rehab center to gain strength and learn alternative approaches to daily activities.

#### **OCCUPATIONAL THERAPY SERVICES**

- Treatment programs for low vision, hand therapy, balance rehabilitation
- Wheelchair positioning and splinting
- Home safety assessments and adaptation equipment training
- Performance skills assessment and treatment

#### **PHYSICAL THERAPY**

Perhaps you have found yourself somewhat limited following an injury, illness or surgery. Physical therapy can help regain strength and mobility through exercise and proper motion of your body parts.

WHOM WE HELP: Adults who have challenges of function or fitness. For example fractures, joint replacements, amputations, arthritis, osteoporosis, or balance disorders.

WHAT TO EXPECT: Recovery does not happen all at once; it may take a brief stay in our rehab center. You can count on your physical therapist to be there every step of the way, until you are well on the road to recovery.

#### PHYSICAL THERAPY

- Neuromuscular re-education rehabilitation, gait training, strength training, manual therapy
- Exercise training
- Electrical stimulation
- Adaptive equipment use and training
- Education and support for patients, family members and caregivers
- Home safety analysis and adaptation recommendations

My mother lives with me and my family. I take care of her most of the day and on weekends. I feel like I need a break. What can I do?

Ask your mother's doctor about respite care. You might be able to bring your mother to a facility such as Lincoln Park Manor to give yourself a much needed break. Lincoln Park Manor offers 24 hour nursing care in a compassionate and quality environment for your mother on a short term basis.

#### What does Medicare cover?

For any eligible beneficiary needing skilled nursing or skilled rehabilitation consistent with Medicare coverage criteria, Medicare Part A coverage will pay for a semi-private room, meals, nursing services, rehabilitation services, medications, supplies and durable medical equipment for up to 100 days in a benefit period. The first 20 days in a nursing home, Medicare covers 100 percent of skilled care. Day 21 through day 100, the resident must pay a daily co-insurance rate. Most supplemental insurance plans will cover the co-pay charges. Patients who are eligible for the services covered under Medicare Part B will be responsible for an annual deductible plus 20 percent of the total charges for services such as occupational therapy, physical therapy and speech therapy, as well as medical supplies. Again, a supplemental insurance could also pay these charges. For more information on Medicare, please visit their website Medicare.gov.

# How do I know if my loved one qualifies for Medicare Part A benefits?

Your loved one must have a Medicare card that reads "hospital insurance" and have days left in their benefit period available to use. A qualifying hospital stay means an inpatient hospital stay of 3 consecutive days or more, starting with the day the hospital admits your loved one as an inpatient\*, but not including the day of discharge from the hospital. The hospital stay must not have occurred more than 30 days prior to entering the nursing home. Further, a physician must certify that your loved one needs skilled nursing or skilled rehabilitation care on a continuing basis, and the need for skilled care must relate to the reason for hospitalization.

\*Are you considered an inpatient?

Staying overnight in a hospital does not mean you are considered as an inpatient status. A doctor must order you to be admitted to the hospital formally to be considered as an inpatient. This is quite different from observation status. Contact us for more information.

## Activities at Lincoln Park Manor go beyond just BINGO

We are focused on making your stay here feel more like home by offering the same type of activities you might do in your spare time. Please feel free to bring your laptop computer, iPad, Kindle or smart phone with you during your stay. Wi-Fi is provided to all residents and will enable you to stay in touch with friends and family online. Even if you do not have your own device, you are welcome to use our community desktop computer located in the library.

The library also offers a lot of reading material such as recent magazines, books, puzzles and an aviary.

Our large screen television has a DVD player and you are welcome to bring your own DVD's from home. The Dayton Metro Library stops by every month with a new supply of movies and books available for everyone to use. We can also provide a portable DVD player that can be brought to your room, if you are not up to going to the library. Hand held games, playing cards, word search, crossword puzzles and Sudoku books offer more variety. Just ask a staff member to bring them to your room.

We are fortunate to have a variety of piano players who come month-

ly to provide musical selections, as well as professional entertainers on a monthly basis. Holidays are special here and parties are one of our favorite past times. Happy Hour is held each Friday complete with adult beverages, soda and snacks. Others functions include free manicures, rousing trivia games, interdenominational Church Services, Catholic Communion and Tea Time on a weekly basis. Oh, and just in case you get bored after all of that, we also play BINGO three times a week. It's easy to see why our patient discharge survey from December 2014 rate our activities as 100% satisfactory!
